Easy Tea Boutique Cards 1




Cutting Tea Boutique Designer Series Paper With the columns of cups right side up: Cut 1 7%" from the left side and then continue across the page cutting 1" strips. you can go back and trim the first one down to 1" You also need to cut each column of cups to fit the 5 ½" tall card.

A2 Card Base 5 ½" x 8 ¼" scored on the long side at 4 ¼"

DSP 1" x 5 ½" Mat 1 ¼" x 5 ½"

Note: I did use a Stampin' Dimensional to adhere my tea bag on the tea cup.



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Easy Tea Boutique Cards 2




Cutting Tea Boutique Designer Series Paper

This teapot paper cut easily into $1\frac{1}{2}$ " columns and then I cut them into $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. This yielded 16 squares from this 6" x 6" piece of DSP.

A2 Card Base 5 ½" x 8 ¼" scored on the long side at 4 ¼"

DSP: cut 3 at 1 ½" x 1 ½" Basic White 1 ½" x 1 ½" Mat: cut 4 at 1 ¾" x 1 ¾"



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Easy Tea Boutique Cards 3



A 6" x 6" piece of DSP can make 4 of these cards by cutting the piece in half at 3" and then rotating the pieces and cutting at 3" again.


Next cut each 3" square into 34" strips keeping the pieces in the correct order to adhere to your card.

A2 Card Base 5 ½" x 8 ¼" scored on the long side at 4 ¼"

DSP 3" \times 3" then cut in $\frac{3}{4}$ " \times 3" strips

My sample has two corners rounded.

The upper and lower right hand corners.




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Easy Tea Boutique Cards 4





Start by Cutting the 3" square piece of DSP from corner to corner as denoted by the yellow dashes.


Use washi tape to hold pieces together to cut along the white dashed lines.

DSP: 3" x 3" then cut into approximately 1" squares. (See cutting guide in upper right corner.)

They end up being slightly bigger than 1"

Mat 3 3/8" x 3 3/8"

DSP Strip ½" X 3 ¾" and punched with banner punch



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Easy Tea Boutique Cards 5



For this card I used two different pieces of the Tea Boutique 6" x 6" DSP.


The tea cup piece was simply cut into 3" squares.

The Sweet Sorbet Floral piece was cut into ½" x 3" strips. Note: I only cut enough to make my card not the entire 6" x 6" piece.

A2 Card Base $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $8 \frac{1}{4}$ " scored on the long side at $4 \frac{1}{4}$ "

DSP 3" x 3" Mat 3 ¼" x 3 ¼"

DSP Strip ½" x 3" Mat Strip ¾" x 3 ¼"
